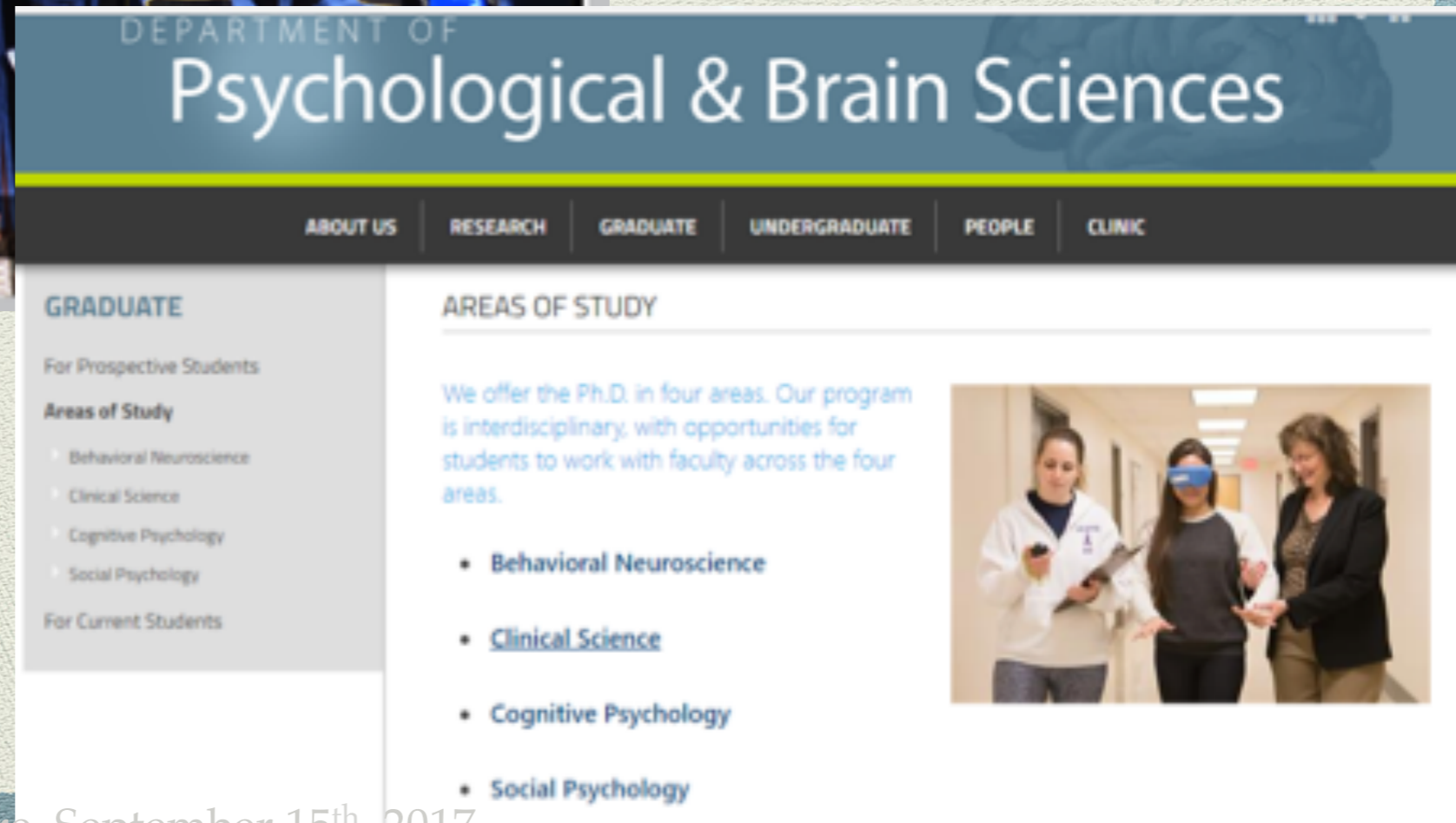
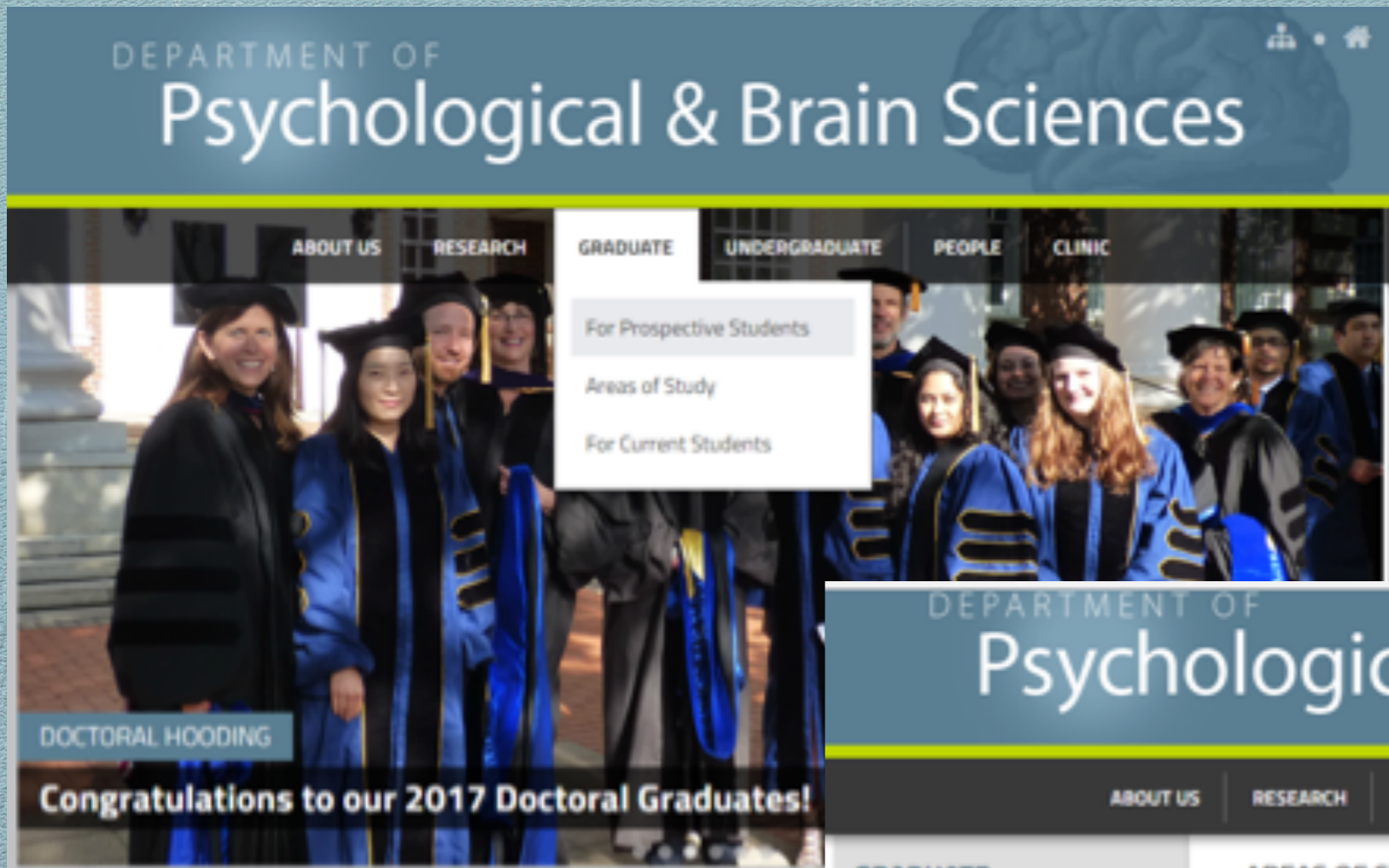

ADMISSION TO THE PROGRAM

Application Deadlines and Information

Students are admitted to the Clinical Science Program to work toward a Ph.D. degree. This is a full-time program, and we do not offer a terminal master's degree. Applications are due in the Graduate Admissions Office by **December 15** for enrollment the following September. There are no spring semester admissions in the Clinical Science Program. Application materials are to be submitted on the **Graduate and Professional Education** website.

Requirements

The Clinical Science Program is especially interested in receiving applications from individuals who have previous research experience. Students with a strong motivation and interest in research, as well as some undergraduate experience in research, fit well with the program. Familiarity with computers, and the ability to use statistical software packages for data analysis, facilitate students' progress in the program. Although not required, a background in Psychology is helpful, especially courses in Research Design and Statistics.

Scores on the **Verbal, Quantitative, and Analytic (Written)** sections of the **Graduate Record Examination (GRE)** are required. The advanced psychology test is helpful but not required.

The application on the **Graduate and Professional Education** website requires **a personal essay**, which should describe your interest in clinical psychology, your research interests, and your fit with the program and with a particular faculty mentor or mentors. You are also asked to submit your **GRE scores, transcripts, curriculum vitae, and three letters of recommendation.**

Mentor Selection

One important criterion for admission is the fit between student research interests and those of faculty members in the program. During the admissions process, each student is matched with a faculty research mentor, on the basis of his or her research interests. The mentor trains the student throughout the program in research and helps to plan coursework and practicum training.

When are you ready to apply to a clinical science program?

- ◆ GRE: 310 total
 - ◆ Verbal, quantitative and analytic (written)
 - ◆ *psychology test is helpful but NOT required
- ◆ GPA: 3.5
 - ◆ *or combination of equal merit
- ◆ Research experience and motivation to continue research
- ◆ Fit with program and potential advisor
- ◆ Background in psychology especially in research design and statistics is helpful

Acquiring Experience

- ◆ Opportunities for undergraduate research
 - ◆ Research Assistant for a professor
 - ◆ Senior/Honors Thesis
 - ◆ Independent Research-Look for departmental grants for undergraduate students
- ◆ Be on the lookout for opportunities to share your research: Poster sessions at conferences & publications
- ◆ Post-Baccalaureate research positions
 - ◆ RA in a university research setting
 - ◆ Post-Bac Fellowships
 - ◆ Master's Program?
- ◆ Clinical volunteering experiences

What is included in the application?

- ◆ Personal statement
 - ◆ Areas of interest
 - ◆ Career goals
 - ◆ How program will help you reach your goals
 - ◆ Research experience (details!)
 - ◆ Advisor preference
- ◆ 3 Recommendation letters
- ◆ Curriculum vitae (CV)
- ◆ GRE scores, transcript

Timeline for application

- ◆ Deadline is December 15
- ◆ September: explore program sites, find programs that fit your interests
 - ◆ Possibly contact potential mentors
 - ◆ Identify potential letter writers and ask them to recommend you; provide them with any application materials you have ready
- ◆ October: refine list of schools to which you want to apply
 - ◆ Research potential mentors to which you would like to apply
 - ◆ Draft statement(s)
 - ◆ Send GRE scores (Oct is latest to take GREs)

Timeline for Application

- ◆ November: refine your statement
 - ◆ Edit your statement yourself AND have at least one other person give you feedback
 - ◆ Touch base with letter writers; if polished enough, send them a draft of your statement
 - ◆ Send transcripts to schools
- ◆ December: finishing touches
 - ◆ Perfect your statement
 - ◆ Fill out online portion of application
 - ◆ Add recommenders to online application, check that they received the link
 - ◆ Preferably before the 15th hit send
 - ◆ WAIT
- ◆ January: hear back

We encourage applicants seeking an application fee waiver to **begin an application** and complete as much as possible without submitting a payment. You may contact the graduate director of the program to which you're applying **here** and send a request with your 9-digit application ID — departments may be able to pay the application fee for you.

Interview Process

- ◆ Invitations generally offered Dec 15-Jan 30
- ◆ Interview weekend, interview day, or phone interview
- ◆ Travel Arrangements:
 - ◆ Usually, graduate students host, transport you during visit
 - ◆ You arrange/pay for travel, you arrange/stipend for travel, program arranges and pays
- ◆ Interview Day:
 - ◆ Interview with potential faculty mentor
 - ◆ Interview with 1-2 other faculty
 - ◆ Information sessions with department chair, program chair, director of clinical training, etc.
 - ◆ individual/paired interviews with grad students in your potential lab
 - ◆ “Down time”: lunch, breaks between interviews, etc.

Interviews-General Advice

- ◆ Respond promptly when setting up interviews
- ◆ Program interviews you and you interview them
- ◆ Dress professionally
- ◆ Competitiveness / Arrogance is a red flag
- ◆ Prepare thoroughly for interview with potential mentor, but more generally for other faculty / grad student interviews
- ◆ Take notes on your way home—your memory will fade
- ◆ After interview, send thank-you emails or notes (everyone you interviewed with, student host, program administrator) within 48-72 hours

Interview Tips

- ◆ Practice interviewing before your first interview
- ◆ Most answers should be about 30 seconds, if interviewer wants more information, they will ask
- ◆ Demonstrate that you understand:
 - ◆ Your research (big picture and details)
 - ◆ The field you are moving toward
- ◆ “Tell me about yourself” = “Tell me about yourself in research and academia
- ◆ Show you understand what a career in clinical psychology entails
- ◆ When asked about a time you overcame something, solved a problem, etc (behavioral questions):
 - ◆ Pick a situation about research or academics
 - ◆ Use examples or stories to “show” rather than “tell” — great for all types of questions
- ◆ Be prepared to ask your own questions! (Think about the message your questions send)
